Swimming 2017-2018

All children in Years 3 and 4 attend swimming sessions at Aldridge School. The sessions are overseen by a trained swimming teacher alongside 2 other adults and children are taught in 3 differentiated groups

We are required to publish how many pupils in Year 6 are meeting the National Curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in difficult water based situations.

For the academic year 2017-2018:

Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety	
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	73%
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]?	63%
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	20%
